For more than 25 years, the Global Development Network (GDN) has championed a simple yet powerful belief: locally generated knowledge, research, and innovation are essential to addressing the world's most pressing development challenges.

Through our investments in researchers, institutions, and partnerships across the Global South, GDN has supported ideas that have informed public policy, strengthened research ecosystems, and contributed to meaningful improvements in people's lives. Today, as development challenges become harder to solve alone, from digital transformation and artificial intelligence to climate resilience, health, and inclusive economic growth, the need for trusted platforms that bring together diverse perspectives, expertise, and solutions has never been greater.

GDN's 2000 conference was held in Tokyo, the year the Government of Japan first supported the Competition, which has since invested more than USD 4.2 million in over 420 researchers and civil society organisations across the Global South. GDC 2026 marks a shift in what we do with the ideas we have funded, from identifying and supporting promising work to building the partnerships that carry it to scale.

Your partnership will help us create an inclusive global platform where researchers and innovators from the Global South can connect with decision-makers, investors, and collaborators; where evidence can inform action; and where innovative solutions can move closer to implementation and scale.

By partnering with GDC 2026, your organisation will help shape a future where research, innovation, policy, and partnerships come together to accelerate inclusive and sustainable development across the Global South. It will provide an opportunity to engage with emerging ideas, connect with influential networks, identify future talent, and contribute to shaping the next generation of development approaches.

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TWO-YEAR INNOVATION PIPELINE

PHASE 1: INCUBATE

GDC 2026 - TOKYO



Through interactive "Co-Creation Labs", global tech experts and local innovators co-design scalable project concepts - Tokyo Portfolio. This will be a curated pipeline of high-potential initiatives supported by multidisciplinary partnerships, implementation roadmaps, and early engagement with prospective funding partners.

PHASE 2: PILOT

2027 INTERIM



Seed-funded concepts from Tokyo are deployed in the field. GDN's Research Facility on Inclusive Digital Transformation already supports implementation research through its pillar on digital public infrastructure, and the strongest AI and digital projects from Tokyo become the first cohort for its new AI pillar. That pillar takes on what the existing work does not, namely securing computing infrastructure, building local-language datasets, and measuring the socio-economic impact of AI in the Global South.

PHASE 3: SCALE

The pilots are formally showcased to international donors and multilateral banks as vetted, scalable blueprints for national implementation.

The Tokyo Portfolio represents the strongest concepts emerging from GDC's Co-Creation Labs, solutions jointly developed by innovators, researchers, policymakers, and technical experts. Your investment directly supports these initiatives as they move from concept to field implementation.

Rather than funding conference logistics, every dollar is directed towards developing, piloting, and refining innovations capable of addressing pressing development challenges across the Global South. Venues and catering across all four locations are covered by our host institutions, so partner contributions fund delegates and pilots.

YOUR INVESTMENT OF USD 25,000 – 50,000 WILL:

- Provide direct seed funding for high-potential initiatives in areas such as artificial intelligence, digital public infrastructure, climate resilience, health systems, education, financial inclusion, and green technologies.

Many of the most promising development solutions originate in Low- and Middle-Income Countries, yet financial barriers often prevent innovators from participating in international policy dialogues. As a Localisation and Access Partner, you will help remove these barriers by enabling researchers, entrepreneurs, and practitioners from the Global South to contribute directly to global discussions and co-create solutions with international partners.

YOUR INVESTMENT OF USD 15,000 WILL:

- Cover international travel, accommodation, visa costs, and conference participation for a cohort of five carefully selected Global South innovators.
- Increase the diversity and quality of the Co-Creation Labs by ensuring that local experience and evidence inform global policy discussions.

- Cover international travel, accommodation, visa costs and full participation for one researcher or practitioner from the Global South
- Keep that innovator connected through the 2027 pilot year, including the design work that follows Tokyo.

ABOUT THE GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CONFERENCE

The Global Development Conference is GDN's flagship event, held in a different region and on a different theme each year, with most participants from low- and middle-income countries (LMICs).

Twenty-five editions have been held in 20 host countries on five continents.

The conference gives early-career and established researchers a platform to present their own work and exchange ideas directly with policymakers, building a global network that outlasts each edition. It offers Southern perspectives on sustainable development and feeds back into how development cooperation is designed and evaluated.



Who is in the room

Across 25 editions, delegates have consistently come predominantly from LMICs, with some editions drawing more than 90% participation from developing and transition economies. Every in-person edition of the conference has drawn between 350 and 700 participants.

Who is on the stage

Sitting heads of state and government have addressed six of the 25 editions. Keynote and plenary speakers have included leading voices in development economics, and LMIC representation on stage has remained consistently high across editions.

SUPPORTERS OF GDN AND GDC

Since 1999, GDN and its flagship conference have been supported by government agencies from 26 countries, eight multilateral development banks, and institutions across the United Nations system. Japanese institutions have been part of that record throughout, a connection that comes full circle with this year's edition hosted in Japan.
